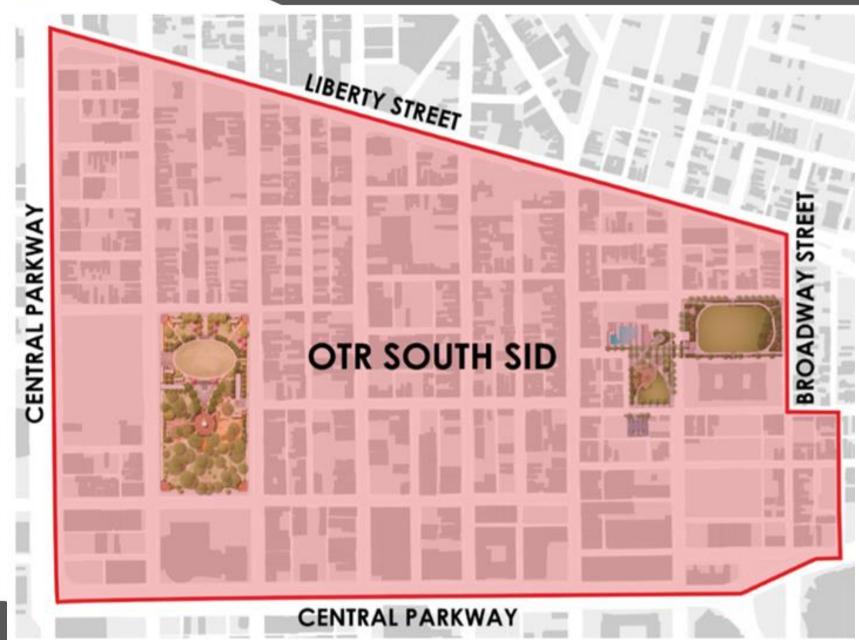


A **Special Improvement District (SID)** is a structured method of raising funds in a geographical area in order to manage and deliver critical services above the level of services provided by local government.

- A steering committee was formed in 2017 to assess viability of a SID in OTR and leveraged 20 years of experience from the downtown SID (DCID).
 - Previously, these services were funded by 3CDC and other private partners for 8 years.
- In 2021 the OTR South SID began it's first 4-year cycle, and the Board of Trustees were elected by property owners to manage the 2021-2024 Services Plan.
 - Contracted OTR District Management, LLC to provide services outlined in the 2021-2024 Services Plan
 - OTR District Management, LLC is a subsidiary of 3CDC

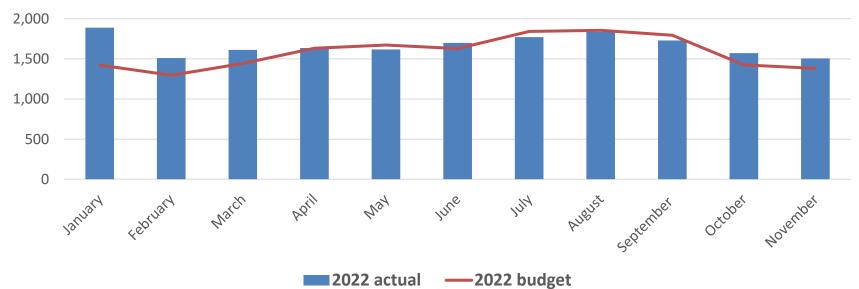

Ambassadorial Hours – 2022 Budget to Actual

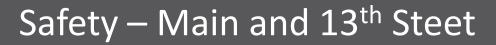


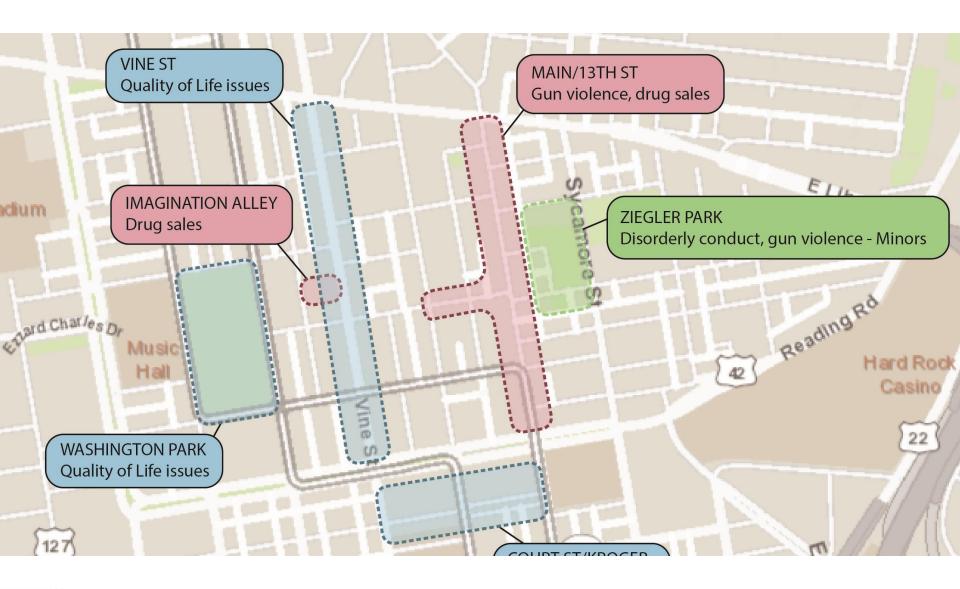

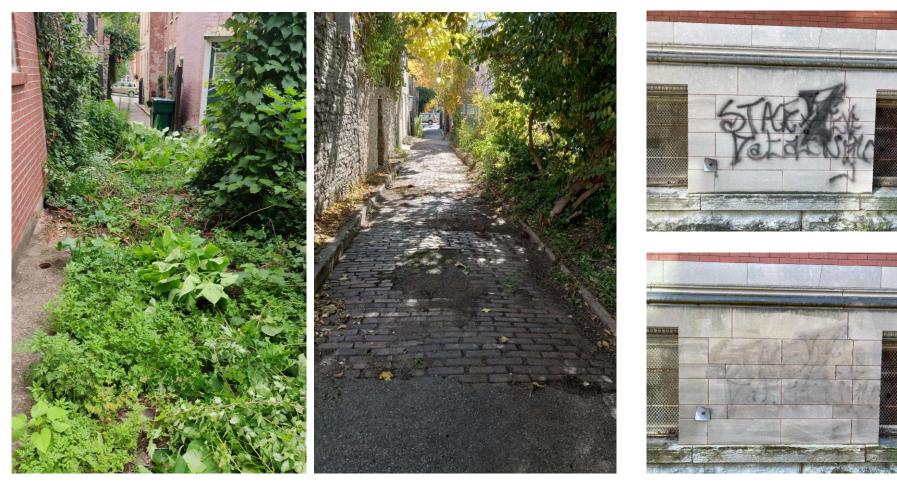

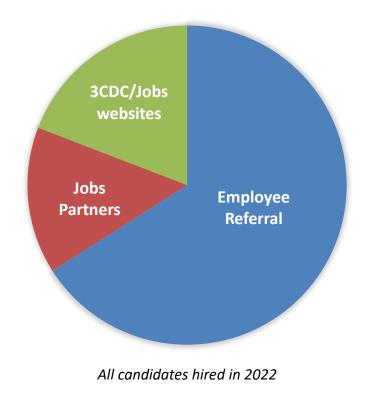


Environment – Staff

Hiring & Staffing

- Average wages:
 - Management: \$31.25
 - Full-Time Ambassador: \$17.56
 - Part-Time Ambassador: \$13.74
- 66% of staff are internal referrals!
- Partner with various jobs programs:
 - Cincinnati Works
 - o CEO Works
 - Hamilton County Office of Re-entry
 - City Gospel Mission
 - Multiple Recovery & Addiction
 Service Organizations
- 52% of staff are fair chance hires
- 30% of staff in recovery

Staff Development- New Partnership Spotlight

- Freestore Foodbank: 3CDC identified a need for more robust wrap around services for new hires to address personal challenges to initially maintaining employment
 - Initial Stabilization Screening 16 staff participated
 - Rental and Transportation Assistance
 - 11 staff provided aid, totaling \$11,230
- **Cornerstone Renter Equity Program** (OTR Residents ONLY): Employees can earn up to \$2,000 annually, which they can use to purchase a home or vehicle, pay off debt, pursue education, address other needs, or continue saving.
 - Financial Coach- paying rent on time & developing a budget
 - Community Engagement- community meetings, volunteering and developing a community support network
 - o 11 staff enrolled

Environment – Staff

Staff Highlight: Manny Christina

- 10+ year veteran of 3CDC, originally started in 2012 at Fountain Square
- Promoted to a Field Coordinator in 2019 and manages our special projects team responsible for detail cleaning including pressure washing, landscaping, and large graffiti removal
- Worked hard with a financial coach in 2021-22 by focusing on improving credit, refinancing vehicular loans and paying off debt
- In 2022 Manny was able to purchase his first home! 3CDC worked to help Manny through securing financing, housing search, and down payment assistance

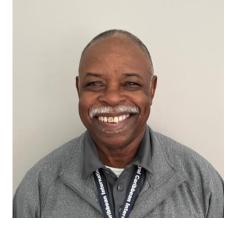

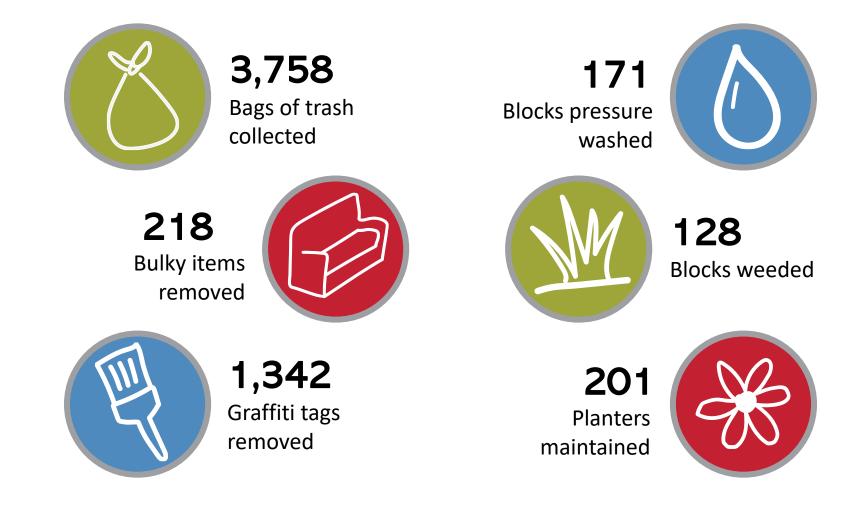

City Partnerships

Urban Forestry/Street Trees:

- 35 trees planned for Fall 2022 10 in OTR
- Significant staffing issues delayed tree planting in spring – contractor is fully staffed for fall
- Monitoring progress weekly with Urban Forestry

Fall 2022 Tree Planting Locations



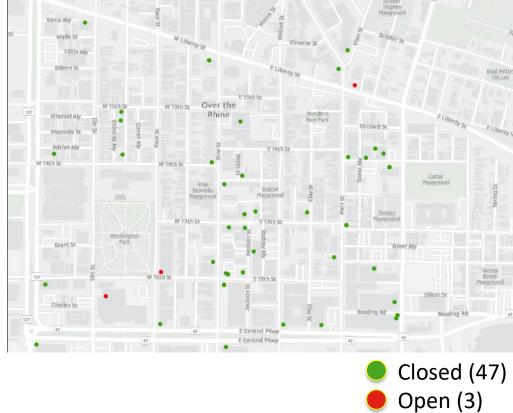


City Partnerships

DOTE/Lighting:

- 50 City lighting CSRs submitted in 2022 – 47 have been closed as of 11/30/22 (94%)
- Several light poles in OTR are maintained by Duke Energy – so issues are submitted through their system for repair
- Establish stronger coordination process with DOTE, Streetcar (Transdev) and Duke Energy to coordinate on repair schedules

Streatery Maintenance

- Email to all businesses with parklets sent mid-October to submit updated Certificate of Insurance (COI) and fill out survey on parklet condition.
 - Included information on vendors to contact for maintenance needs
 - Updated COIs uploaded to Streatery map shared with DOTE – 19 updated as of 11/30
- Inspections to be completed annually in Q1 moving forward.
- Concrete bollards to be installed at 14 high priority locations

Volunteer Projects

- North of Liberty Cleanup:
 - 9/14/22 25 volunteers from GE removed graffiti at Findlay Market, landscaped at Cornerstone Renter Equity and weeded at OTR People's Garden.
 - 10/9/22 Partnered with Simply Zero on litter cleanup on Vine/Race Streets; 12 volunteers cleaned up 8 blocks!
 - 10/21/22 12 GE volunteers removed graffiti & weeded on Green St & Vine St

Homeless Outreach

- Contracted through Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health Services
- Employ 4 FT outreach workers & 1 seasonal outreach worker
- Connect individuals experiencing homelessness with housing, mental health & substance abuse services, jobs and more.





Jobs Van

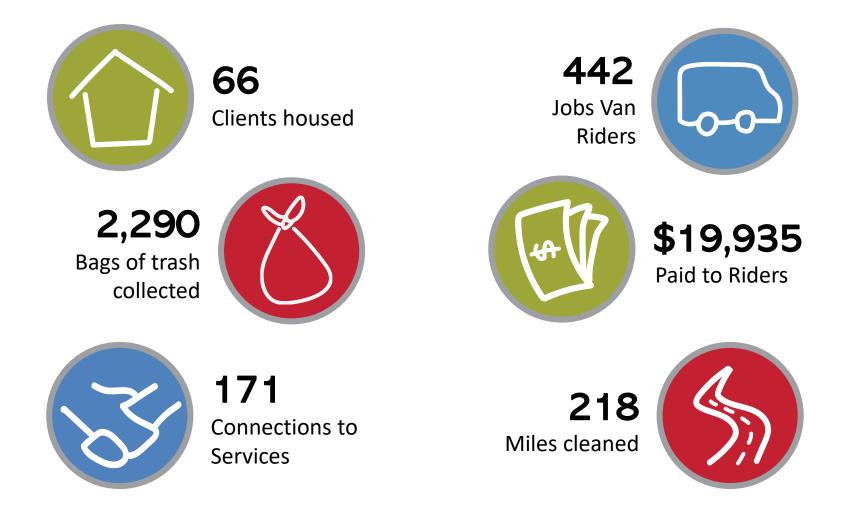
- Contracted through City Gospel Mission

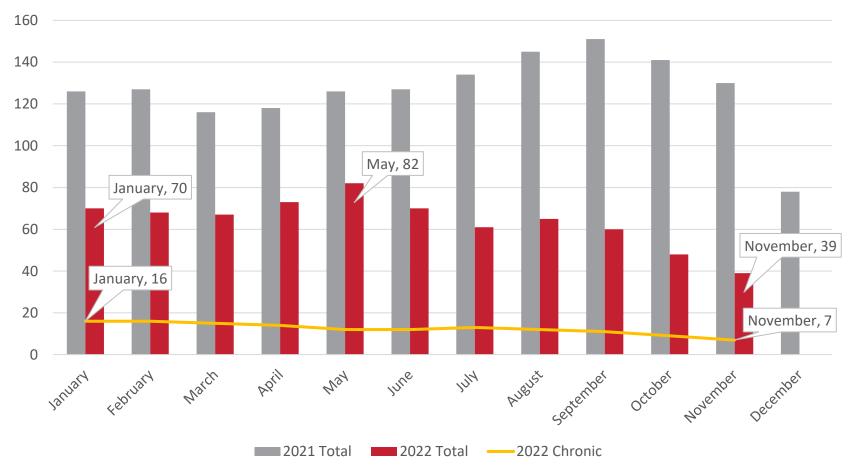

Unsheltered Homeless Clients - Downtown



*Has been homeless for at least 12 months or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years, as long as the combined occasions equal at least 12 months and each break in homelessness separating the occasions included at least 7 consecutive nights of not living as described.



Chronic Homeless Population

- Chronically homeless individuals with dual-diagnosis of drug addiction and mental health present a unique treatment challenge.
- Progress:
 - Identify Chronic Clients list of chronically homeless & highprofile clients updated weekly.
 - Facilities meeting 11/9 with High Risk Committee comprised of service providers to discuss needs & barriers in housing process.
 - Legal System regular communication with One City to provide services in drug court. Additional intervention will be required as we move forward.
