
How do property owners report issues within the District?

 - Directs stakeholder issues to DOTE, CPD, and other partner agencies as needed







Ambassadorial Total Hours




• 2021 projected hours March-Dec






Alleys

3CDC Operations Staff are working to proactively address alleys prior to spring to ensure weeds, litter and other debris are removed regularly.

- Staff have begun cleaning alleys as of 3/7 and will continue regular maintenance.
- Applying preemergent in late March to deter weed growth.



Tree Mulching

Volunteers will work with Operations Staff to get a head start on mulching tree wells from March 25th through 27th.

- Volunteers will focus on main thoroughfares and work with staff to pull up grates for cleaning prior to adding mulch.
- Staff will continue mulching into the spring.





Environment – Snow Removal

Snow Removal- committee work group

3CDC staff met with Andy Hutzel and Robert Wellington on 3/11 to review snow plan. 3CDC spent time reviewing route timing, equipment, and area covered during most recent snows. Another meeting with working group will be required, next steps:

- Map out coverage area by block, showing order in which blocks are cleaned
- Explore options to provide additional staff/equipment and resources on call for larger snows
- Review equipment needed if streets/alleys would be added to the services plan
- Explore communication options for updating stakeholders on real time progress during snows






2020 vs. 2021 Open Cases
