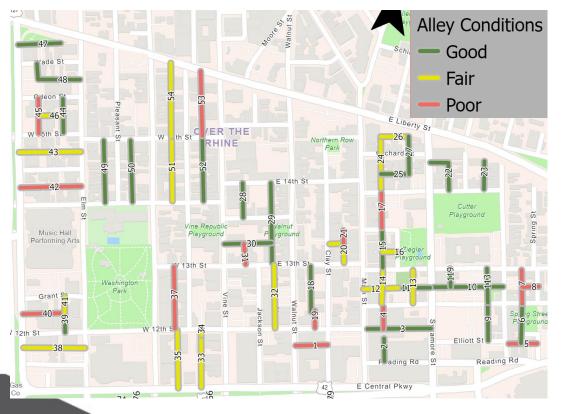






Alleys

 - Submit service requests to City for pavement-related issues



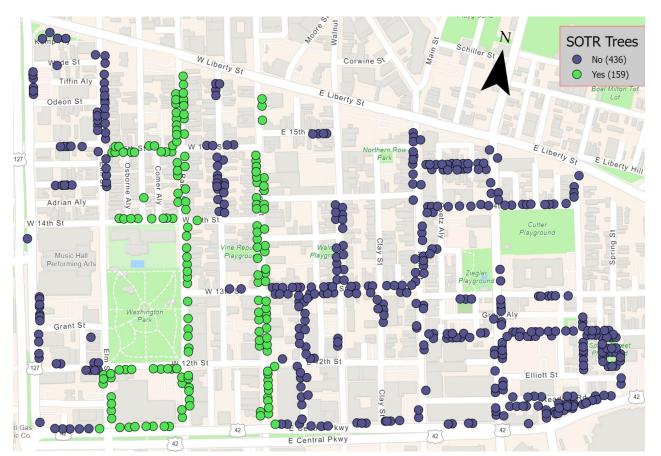




Spring Projects

 - Touching up paint on poles

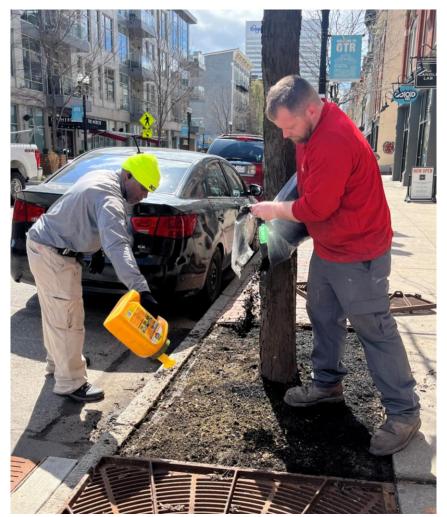

Safety Program – Ongoing Challenges

- Active drug sales and other associated activities
 - 13th street corridor, Main Street, Woodward Street
 - 3CDC (with contributions from Urban Sites and Eagle Realty) committed to \$100M to off-duty detail
- Scooters- Meeting with city week of 4/18 to discuss geo-fencing, CPD resources to follow on illegal activity, pedestrian safety, and underage use
- Vehicular break-ins are spiking across the city, especially in OTR
 - Just in Q1, 21 guns have been reported stolen
 - CPD increase in patrols and working with CPD to target scooter use
